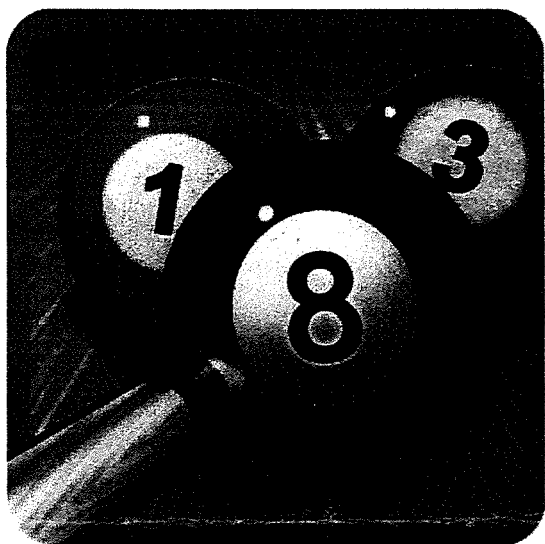


# MICHIGAN EAGLES STATE POOL TOUR

## EAGLES STATE MEN'S SINGLES

1. All players must have a paid-up Aerie dues receipt.
2. The singles event will be held at Lakeside of Muskegon #3306 (Noton Shores. On Jan.. 26<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> 2018. Friday  
Jan 25<sup>th</sup> practice and nine ball tournament at 7 p.m. Players playing in Nine Ball tournament not registered for mens singles will pay \$5.00 green fee.
3. Players must register prior to the start of play. Entry fees will be **\$30** per player.
4. Please have all entries and fees in ASAP. **Bids for the 2020 singles event and all future events open for bids.**
5. Entry fees are nonrefundable. A \$5 green fee is included to help the hosting Aerie with expenses.
6. **Late entries received after the deadline, or added the day of the tournament, MAY be subject to pay an additional \$10.00 per person.**
7. All matches will be a race (TBD) double elimination.
8. A coin flip will decide who breaks the 1<sup>st</sup>. game. Breaks will then alternate between players. After your match is announced players have five minutes to report to your table. No shows will be a forfeit.
9. If a match is tied at the HILL, there will be another flip of the coin for break.
10. One time out per game. Only the shooter can call time out during the 1 minute shot clock. Only the shooter may call a **foul**. If a foul is called by anyone else it will not be acknowledged.
11. A **LEGAL BREAK**: The player must break from behind the headstring, and either
  - (1) Pocket an object ball, or
  - (2) Drive 3 balls to a rail.Failure to do so will result in a re-rack. The same player will break again (ONE RE-BREAK ONLY). The cue ball must make direct contact with the rack.
12. 8-ball on break is a win unless there is a scratch.
13. Scratch on break – **BALL IN HAND ANYWHERE ON TABLE.**
14. If on the break, there is a miscue, player can stop the cue ball before it hits the rack. **ONE RE-BREAK ONLY.**
15. After the break the table is still open until a called ball is made.
16. Upon choice the player can use any combination, but cannot hit the 8-ball first.
17. **CUE BALL IN HAND RULE**: player has ball in hand, he can place the cue ball anywhere on the table.

18. The cue ball is always live.
19. When placing the cue ball, the player can use any part of the stick, except the shooting part of the tip.
20. The shooter must have one foot on the floor. FAILURE IS BALL IN HAND.
21. Call ball and pocket on all unobvious shots (BANKS, CAROMS).
22. A 1-minute shot clock will be in effect. Time will start when all balls have stopped motion. Time will be stopped only for racking and player interference from another table. Shooter will get a 15-second warning. If the cue ball is not in motion within the warning it is a foul – BALL IN HAND.
23. If a player moves a ball, other than the cue ball, the opponent has the choice of leaving it there, or moving it back to where it was before the player shoots. If it happens after the shot they still have the choice. If it happens on the 8 ball shot, and the 8-ball crosses the path of where the ball was, then is pocketed, it is loss of game.
24. **LOSS OF GAME:**
  - a) 8-Ball jumps off the table.
  - b) 8-Ball on break and scratch.
  - c) 8-Ball made in wrong pocket.
  - d) 8-Ball made out of turn.
  - e) Scratch on the 8-ball.
  - f) Player knocks the 8-ball in a pocket with hand or stick.
  - g) Player shooting out of turn.
25. On all shots after choice: The player must make contact with their own balls first then,
  - (1) pocket a ball, or
  - (2) cause a ball to contact a rail.FAILURE IS BALL IN HAND.
26. If the object ball is frozen to the rail, after contact the object ball must be driven to another rail or be pocketed, or cause another ball to contact a rail or be pocketed. FAILURE IS BALL IN HAND.
27. If the cue ball scratches: BALL IN HAND.
28. A double stroke is a foul: BALL IN HAND.
29. If there is a chance of a push shot the player must elevate his stick at least 45 degrees or shoot away from the object ball. FAILURE IS BALL IN HAND.
30. Any ball that jumps off the table will be re-spotted – EXCEPT THE CUE OR 8-BALL.
31. When playing a safe, the player must call a safe. A safe is when you intend to make a ball and give up the shot.
32. A stalemate game will result in a re-rack.
33. On all close shots stop play and have the tournament director or designee watch the shot.
34. If player is asked to be stopped and the player continues to shoot, It will be ball in hand to the opposing player. If play is not stopped for all pushes and close hits it will be ruled in favor of the shooter.
